Feb 15 - James Rivers Movement: James Rivers is a New Orleans musical treasure. He plays a mixture of rock, progressive jazz, rhythm and blues, and gospel. It is the sort of music that implies something for everybody. Rivers, one of only three jazz musicians ever known to play the bagpipes, would probably call himself a saxophonist, but his forte is really an amazing musical dexterity that has helped him master a dozen other instruments.

Feb 22 – Topsy Chapman and Solid Harmony: Performing all over the world, Topsy Chapman dazzles crowds with her suave style and clear melodious voice. To hear her is a pure delight. Topsy was one of the original cast members of the Broadway hit "One Mo'Time." topsychapman.com

March 1- Raphael Bas and Harmonouche: Haromnouche, an amalgam created from the words harmonious, harmonica and "manouche" the French word for Gypsy. Fun, fresh, and creative, Harmonouche plays music loaded with charisma and international flavor. This New Orleans gypsy traditional jazz band combines world class musicianship and a good dose of humor to deliver a unique sound orchestrated with jazz guitar, diatonic harmonica, singing, whistling, accordion, piano, clarinet and saxophone. March 8 – BB King's Blues Club All-Star Band: This group is the most talented collection of musicians in the Mid-South.

Professional musicians Billy Thompson on guitar, Daryl Johnson on bass, Jeff Spence on piano, Earl Smith on drums, Chucky C on sax, Tracy Griffen on trumpet, and vocalist Joy Owens make up The BB King's All-Stars. As the house band of BB King's Blues Club, these guys know how to jam. Performing rhythm and blues, classic soul, blues rock, and rock and roll. Put on your dancing shoes!

March 15 – The Yat Pack: The Yat Pack is a New Orleans based band modeled on the 60's Vegas Swing Era. They will perform classic big band numbers by Frank Sinatra, Louis Prima, Dean Martin, and Bobby Darin as well as contemporary artists like Michael Bublé, Billy Joel, and Harry Connick, Jr. They will also mix in a heavy dose of good old New Orleans R&B. theyatpack.com

March 22 – Pfister Sisters: Holley Bendtsen, Yvette Voelker, Debbie Davis and Amasa Miller comprise one of the few groups that represent the New Orleans swing era with their recreation of the Boswell Sisters arrangements and the only act featuring vocal jazz harmony. April 5 – Phil Melancon: Phil performs the musical spirit and style of his hometown, New Orleans. As complex as gumbo, he cooks up a variety of musical flavors for your enjoyment.
