AUG 5 - Bobby Cure and The Poppa Stoppas: Join us for a rocking good evening as we travel back in time with “Bobby Cure and the Poppa Stoppas” to the Doo-Wop days of the 1950s when the Moon was Blue and the question of the day was “Why Do Fools Fall in Love”.

AUG 12 - James Rivers Movement: James Rivers plays a mixture of rock, progressive jazz, rhythm and blues, and Gospel. One of only three jazz musicians ever known to play the bagpipes, James Rivers would probably call himself a saxophonist, but his forte is really an amazing dexterity that has helped him master a dozen other instruments.
